

Cartography

SSEE has the only cartography unit in the University with two cartographers, one full time and the other part time. The cartographic unit produces a high quality computer generated maps and figures for publications, research reports and theses, and teaching materials and gives advice and assistance to Honours and postgraduate students. It also provides cartographic services to other Departments and entities within the university as well as outside bodies.

The unit maintains a specialised map collection for teaching and research.

In 2007, maps and figures were produced for a large number of publications. The majority was for SAGES members, including cartographic work for 9 PhD theses and 1 Honours theses. In addition, a large number of maps and figures were produced for staff members within the university. The maps and diagrams produced were quite diverse.
